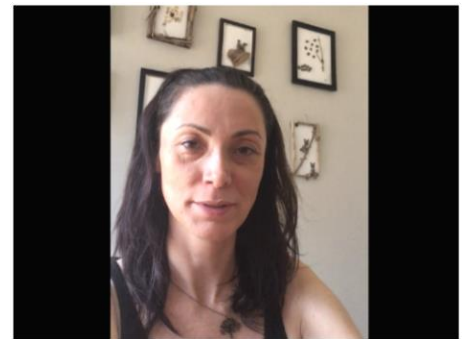
Funded by the Allen and Milli Gould Foundation, the free **Women's Entrepreneurship (W.E.)** program annually helps 21 women with low income by providing a combination of mentorship, individualized business coaching and training. The result is a comprehensive business plan with financial forecasts for the first year of business. *Photo: W.E. Graduates 2016*

The W.E. Group #4 participants finished the 20 business training classes on March 15th and each participant was paired with a mentor, beginning the implementation of their business plan.

We are now accepting applications for W.E. Group #5, for which the business training classes will start on May 9th.

Alternatively, if you are interested in a flexible programming schedule, you might consider the **Micro-lending (ML)** program, funded by the Ontario Women's Directorate since 2013. The free ML program will continue to operate in 2017 by helping women with limited incomes start a small business with a much needed loan and business plan.

Applications are provided at weekly Business Program Info Sessions held Wednesday, April 5, 12 & 26 at the YWCA Hamilton.

The YWCA Hamilton has a new afterschool program for grade 6 girls, called STEM Girls Club, and there are still a few spots left! The afterschool club has just started and will be held on Tuesdays and Thursdays at 155 Queen St. N. from 3:30pm until 5:30pm, throughout the school year, until the end of the girls' grade 8 year.

As part of the Hamilton Community Foundation's ABACUS project, the STEM Girls Club aims to support academic engagement and inspire girls to pursue future post-secondary educations and careers in S.T.E.M. The STEM Girls Club will include activities, discussions, and games

that build on topics in school and will foster the confidence needed to excel in these currently male dominated fields.

Women in 'IT'

WIT Information Sessions

Held every Monday at 10AM

Women in IT (WIT) is an excellent **free** program for women with multiple barriers to upgrade their skills, get industry certification and access to employment opportunities. We are now accepting applications for the upcoming program starting in June 2017. To become eligible for this program one must be unemployed, eligible to work in Canada (Citizen, PR and Conventional Refugee), have low income (below \$25,665 per year), have CLB 7 (if education is outside of Canada) or completion of High School (in Canada), and have experience/education in IT (preferred). After completing this program, participants will receive a Web Design and Development certificate from Mohawk College, placement as a Web Developer and training on various techniques for personal development skills, leadership and job search. We provide bus tickets and childcare for participants in the program.

On March 27, we had 18 participants graduate from the Women in IT (WIT) program. 8 of these participants have already secured a job as a freelancer or Web Developer in the IT industry.

Bridging Programs

The Bridging Programs with YWCA Hamilton assists professionals with international education and experience in the Information and Communications Technology (ICT) and Environmental sectors to obtain the requirements needed to access employment in their field. Participants in the bridging programs will learn about employer expectations,

workplace and occupational requirements, labor market trends in ICT and environmental sectors, effective self-marketing strategies and business etiquette.

Participants will also receive occupation-specific skills upgrading, Mohawk College completion certificate (upon completion of 180 hours), job search and career development support, soft skills training and coaching and workplace exposure: placement, internship and mentoring.

The following courses (at Mohawk College) will be offered in Spring 2017: GIS for Bridging, Renewable Energy, Server Administration and Business Fundamentals for IT.

Calling all youth seeking employment and Hamilton employers

YWCA Hamilton is recruiting participants and employers for our SISTER (Success in Service Training and Employment Retention) Program! The SISTER Program is a youth employment program involving four weeks of paid training and 12 weeks of paid placement in the service sector.

To be eligible for the program, you must be:

- A woman between the ages of 15 and 30 at the time of intake
- Not in receipt of Employment Insurance (EI) benefits
- Legally entitled to work in Canada and Ontario
- A Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person who has been granted refugee status in Canada under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act
- In need of assistance in order to overcome employment barriers
